Bay View Refuse & Recycling Service, Inc. is submitting the following rates in pursuant to EXHIBIT B, Rate Adjustment Methodology of our Franchise Agreement with the Kensington Community Services District. The amounts are computed in accordance with the Consumer Price Index, (CPIU) in the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose area ending August 2016. The adjustment since August 2015 equals 3.1%. We have attached a copy of the Department of Labor Statistics table for your review.
