Board President Len Welsh called the meeting to order at 7:34 PM and took roll call. Vice President Lipscomb, Director Lloyd, Director Gillette, President Welsh, General Manager/Chief of Police Harman, and District Administrator Wolter were present. Director Toombs was absent.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Leonard Schwartzburd asked President Welsh whether he supported the proposed bond measure. President Welsh responded that he did. Dr. Schwartzburd then asked about a Public Records Request he had made. GM/COP Harman responded that he knew nothing about such a request.

A. Stevens Delk said of the December 2013 minutes that one of her comments was inaccurately recorded and that motions were not verbatim. She also noted that some meeting recordings were not posted on the website.

President Welsh asked staff for information about posting recordings on the District's website. Sergeant Hui responded the District recently had a webserver change and that the recordings should be current through the end of last year. He said that uploading each meeting recording is complex and takes approximately one hour and that it needs to be done while others in the office are not using the computer system.

Peter Liddell announced that the Public Safety Council would be making a presentation on March 20th about solving neighbor conflicts.

Gretchen Gillfillan announced that there would be a path clean up on the upper Ardmore Path at 10:00 on Saturday, March 22, 2014.

BOARD COMMENTS

Director Lloyd reported that last November he, Sergeant Barrow, and District Administrator Lynn Wolter met with West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD) Board member Madeline Kronenberg and Superintendent Dr. Bruce Harter in response to an earlier presentation that had been made to the KPPCSD by School Board member Charles Ramsey. In that presentation, Mr. Ramsey had encouraged the KPPCSD to partner with the School District.

Director Lloyd said that, subsequently at the KPPCSD's November Board meeting, he had reported on the WCCUSD meeting, saying that KPPCSD had asked that the WCCUSD resume paying for the school crossing guard and assist with the cost of providing police service on WCCUSD property.

Director Lloyd said further that Mr. Ramsey, now the WCCUSD Board President, had called a few days prior to March 12th to let him know that a consideration of a partnership with the KPPCSD would be on the March 12, 2014 WCCUSD Board meeting agenda. President Ramsey recommended that Director Lloyd attend the WCCUSD Board meeting with staff, including a member of the Kensington Police Department.

Director Lloyd concluded by saying that he, GM/COP Harman, and District Administrator Wolter had attended the WCCUSD Board meeting and that the WCCUSD had approved our request.

WCCUSD Board President, Charles Ramsey addressed the KPPCSD Board and the community. He said that it was important to accomplish things for all parts of the School District and said that safety was a concern. Mr. Ramsey said that he had requested that the Kensington partnership be placed on the school board agenda for an up or down vote. He said that he had asked that Director Lloyd attend the school board meeting with staff. Mr. Ramsey said that School Superintendent Dr. Harter recommended approval of Mr. Ramsey's proposal for a three-year agreement for up to \$50,000 per year, saying that this amount would provide for flexibility in the event of overruns or cost increases.

Mr. Ramsey said that passage of Proposition 30, with its ¼ cent sales tax, had provided billions of dollars to schools and specifically \$12.5 million to the WCCUSD. He said that this had eliminated any structural deficit that the school district had. He said that the economic recovery, along with Governor Brown's local control funding formula had provided additional significant funds and that, as a result, the WCCUSD now had \$24 million in reserves though only \$8 million was required.

Mr. Ramsey said that he understood that special districts were strapped and that he wanted to work with the Kensington Police Department to ensure ongoing safety. He said that, as part of its concern for safety, the WCCUSD would be installing surveillance systems at all its schools, including the Hilltop School. He said that he hoped this would enable the Kensington Police Department to better know what's going on at the school. He concluded by thanking Director Lloyd and said "if you never ask, you'll never know", and that "a closed mouth never gets fed."

Mr. Ramsey concluded by complimenting the KPPCSD Board, saying that this partnership would free up resources to help in other ways, and that \$50K would go a long way in assisting the KPPCSD.

Director Gillette asked Mr. Ramsey if other schools were being treated similarly. Mr. Ramsey said that the WWCUSD already had relationships with Hercules, El Cerrito, Richmond, San Pablo, and with the County Sheriff for the unincorporated areas. Mr. Ramsey said the WCCUSD was sitting on a lot of money and that this was not meant to be a savings account. He said that these were taxpayer dollars that should be used to strengthen communities and that it was important to stay pro-active.

President Welsh thanked Mr. Ramsey for his assistance with the \$50,000 for KPPCSD operations and expressed sympathy regarding Mr. Ramsey's ill father.

Mr. Ramsey complimented Hilltop Principal Judy Sanders and the quality of the school. He said that, during his tenure on the WCCUSD Board, the school population had increased from 450 to almost 600 students and that many families wanted to send their children to this school. Mr. Ramsey concluded by saying that local control had been returned to the WCCUSD, there was no longer a State trustee, and that local control was important to partnerships such as this.

Director Lloyd thanked Sergeant Barrow and District Administrator Wolter for initiating this effort and thanked GM/COP Harman for his leadership.

Director Gillette reported that she had attended an ethics class. She said that she had learned during the class that it was not a gift of public funds for one district to give money to another district. She said she hoped that the Fire District would take the same attitude as the WCCUSD.

Director Gillette said that she had a procedural comment. She commended Tony but said that she would like to see such that items come to the board in the future.

President Welsh said that Director Lloyd had asked him about proceeding and that he had responded that it would be okay to proceed.

Director Lloyd went on to say that, following the initial meeting with the WCCUSD, he had come to the Board at its November meeting and had given a full report. He agreed that protocol could have been better but that timing of the school board meeting prevented that.

Vice President Lipscomb reported on the Policy Committee. She said that the redline version contained numerous changes and that work was being done to convert this into a readable version. She said that everything was being crosschecked and reviewed with GM/COP Harman so that suggested policy changes reflected reality. She said that section 1000 had been completed and that section 2000 would be worked on next.

Vice President Lipscomb reported there had been an Arlington Lights committee meeting earlier in the day at Supervisor Gioia's office. She said there were no longer any complaints about the lights, with respect to height or brightness. She said there would be more discussion about the downtown lights, hopefully with input from the businesses, and that a decision likely would be forthcoming after one more meeting.

Vice President Lipscomb also commented on Joan Gallegos' recent passing and thanked Katie Gluck for her thoughtfulness in helping Joan.

President Welsh said that he would speak about the Fire District and the Services District later in the agenda.

STAFF COMMENTS

District Administrator reported that a new issue of the CSDA magazine had just arrived and that it contained a notice about Special District Leadership Academy scholarships available to special district board members.

DISTRICT NEW BUSINESS

1. KPPCSD Board President Len Welsh presented KPPCSD Proclamation 2014-1, proclaiming March 2014 as American Red Cross month.

GM/COP Harman invited Peter Liddell to join him at the front of the room and then read Proclamation 2014-1. The Proclamation cited the Red Cross' many accomplishments and encouraged everyone to support this humanitarian organization. GM/COP Harman presented the proclamation to Mr. Liddell.

**MOTION: Vice President Lipscomb moved, and Director Gillette seconded, that the Board adopt Proclamation 2014-1.
Motion passed 4 to 0.**

A member of the public asked that the words, "in the year of our Lord" be stricken from the language contained in Proclamation 2014-1. Board consensus agreed with this.

2. KPPCSD Director Pat Gillette presented the negotiated Extension Agreement between the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District and the Kensington Police Officers Association for the period between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014.

Director Gillette summarized the proposed one-year extension of the contract. She reported that she and Director Toombs had been meeting with Sergeant Barrow and Master Sergeant Hull since last summer. During that time they had discussed various options. It had been concluded that the best decision was to enter into a one-year contract because of the uncertainties regarding property tax revenue, the Affordable Care Act, and pension reform laws. She recommended a one-year contract for the period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014 with a 3% increase. She said that the officers hadn't had a pay increase since 2010 and that the 3% increase would place the officers' pay at mid-range. She concluded by complimenting the officers and their commitment to low crime rates and for their being very attentive.

Director Gillette said that the negotiating committee would be entering into negotiations promptly for the upcoming contract, at which time contributions to benefits, pensions, and other issues would be addressed.

President Welsh thanked Directors Gillette and Toombs for their hard work.

Celia Concus asked for clarification regarding the District's and Officers' portions of contributions to PERS.

GM/COP Harman replied that, for every dollar in salary for KPPCSD and all other municipalities participating in PERS, employers must pay 36.477% into PERS this fiscal year. He also said that in addition to that the District pays the officers' 9% portion. He said that this portion was negotiable and that, at one time, KPPCSD had negotiated to cover the officers' 9% portion.

Karl Kruger said that he was glad about the one-year contract but that he would not have granted a 3% increase because the officers had received changes in classifications and because others had taken pay cuts. He also urged the Board to have a contract before the extension expired and before the budget was set.

Director Gillette said she hoped that a contract would be in place before the extension ran out, and she thanked Sergeant Barrow and Master Sergeant Hull for their hard work.

President Welsh commented on the wonderful service that the police provide to the community and said that the Board valued the relationship with the department.

MOTION: Vice President Lipscomb moved, and President Welsh seconded, that the Board adopt the contract, as written on pages 54 through 55, as a further extension of the agreement.

3. The Park Buildings Committee presented the educational material for the Community Center Safety Project drafted by the Lew Edwards Group for Board discussion and approval.

Vice President Lipscomb presented the educational material developed and recommended by the Lew Edwards Group, which had been hired by the District to develop educational materials. She reviewed the letters that would be sent to the community as well as the FAQ's and the Power Point presentation documents to be used with respect to the ballot measure to make improvements to the Park Buildings.

Vice President Lipscomb said that the Park Committee and counsel had reviewed these documents and had signed off on them.

GM/COP Harman stressed that was strictly educational material.

Vice President Lipscomb said that the Board could not campaign and that these materials had been developed with professionals to ensure that they stayed within the educational limits.

GM/COP Harman reiterated that both the District's counsel and bond counsel had reviewed the documents to ensure that they were within the guidelines of the law.

Leonard Schwartzburd said that he thought the information contained in the documents could be considered "pro" and felt that there should be an opportunity for dissenting opinion.

Park Buildings Committee member, Lisa Caronna, responded that the documents had been developed by professionals, that they were factual, and that they provided information about the proposed building improvements and bond measure. She further said that the information could be used to argue either side of the measure.

Following further discussion, Director Gillette and Vice President Lipscomb offered to meet with the Park Buildings Committee to review the documents to ensure that they were as neutral as reasonably possible.

MOTION: Director Gillette moved, and Vice President Lipscomb seconded, that the Board adopt the materials as presented, with the caveat that the board would authorize an ad hoc committee composed of Director Lipscomb and herself to work with two members of the Park Committee – assuming that neither of those members was a member of the Board – to remove any language or insert any language to ensure that the documents would be objective.

Motion passed 4 to 0

4. KPPCSD Board President Len Welsh discussed his initial conversations with representatives of the Kensington Fire Protection District (KFPD) regarding the lease agreement between the KFPD and the KPPCSD.

President Welsh reported on a presentation he had made at the prior night's Fire District Board meeting. He said there was a sense among members of the community that the Fire Board could help the KPPCSD in its time of budgetary difficulty and that one thing the Fire Board could do was not to charge the KPPCSD for occupying space in the Public Safety Building.

President Welsh said that the Fire District owned the building and was charging the KPPCSD \$35,000 per year to occupy part of the building and that the KPPCSD also paid 50% of routine maintenance and utilities costs.

President Welsh said that at the prior night's meeting he had asked the Fire Board to consider not charging any rent or charging a dollar per year. He pointed out that the Fire Board had been renting fire trucks to El Cerrito for a dollar per year.

President Welsh further reported that, in response to Fire Board President Janice Kosel's request, he had asked KPPCSD's attorneys to prepare an opinion letter about whether this would constitute a gift of public funds. He said that it was clear that this would not be a

gift of public funds for the following reasons: the two boards serve a single community (how could one make a gift to oneself) and no private purpose would be served. He also noted that the Fire District received material benefits from the KPPCSD: they served side-by-side during emergency calls; they received security services by having the police occupy the building while fire personnel weren't present; they received reception services; and an on-site emergency phone.

President Welsh said it was important for fire and police to work together to serve the holistic needs of the community.

President Welsh concluded by reporting that the Fire Board had met in closed session but had taken no action and that they likely would discuss the matter further at their next meeting.

MOTION: Director Gillette moved, and Vice President Lipscomb seconded, that the meeting be adjourned.

Board President Tony Lloyd called the meeting to order at 6:37 PM and took roll call. Director Toombs, Director Lipscomb, Vice President Gillette, Director Welsh, President Lloyd, General Manager/Chief of Police Harman, and District Administrator Wolter were present.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None

CLOSED SESSION

At 6:38, the Board entered into Closed Session to confer with Labor Negotiators (Government Code Section 54957.6). Agency Representatives: Patricia Gillette and Chuck Toombs. Employee Organization: Kensington Police Officers Association.

OPEN SESSION

At 7:31 PM, the Board returned to Open Session.

President Lloyd reported that, during its Closed Session, the Board discussed collective bargaining with the Kensington Police Officers Association. He said that discussions were continuing and that progress was being made.

President Lloyd took roll call. All Directors, GM/COP Harman, and District Administrator Wolter were present.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Joseph Holmes stated that the monastery (3.4 acres and adjacent to Blake Gardens) was for sale for \$1.95 million. He suggested that the community consider purchasing the property.

Mabry Benson questioned why the County couldn't install stop signs at the intersection of Arlington and Rincon Avenues.

BOARD COMMENTS

Director Lipscomb reported that the Policy Committee had met earlier in the week and that progress was being made on the Policy Manual. Director Lipscomb commended Barbara Dilts for her work as a Committee member and said that the next meeting would be held January 14, 2014. She concluded by saying that the Committee was going through the Policy Manual, which was based on the CSDA Sample Manual, and streamlining it where possible.

Director Lipscomb reported that a teardrop style light fixture had been installed at the intersection of Arlington Avenue and Ardmore. She encouraged residents to take a look at it and provide feedback.

Director Lipscomb reported that an appeal of the six AT&T cell towers, which were approved by the County Planning Commission, would be heard on December 17, 2013 at 9:30 AM. She said that the Commission had determined that the KMAC Small Lot Ordinance did not apply to cell towers and that citing health effects and property value impacts would not be a basis for residents objecting.

President Lloyd asked Director Lipscomb about the anticipated Policy Manual timeline. She replied that she hoped the proposed amendments would be ready by June 2014.

In response to Joseph Holmes' public comments, Vice President Gillette said that she thought it would be a good idea to purchase the Monastery, but she didn't know how the community could afford it.

Vice President Gillette reported that the drug store was going out of business and that she was concerned about this.

Vice President Gillette said that this was her one-year anniversary serving on the District Board. She thanked the community for its support and commented on the changed tenor of the Board meetings.

Vice President Gillette reported that the negotiating team was continuing to work and that she hoped to have something to report in a few months.

Director Welsh reported that he was pleased with the regulatory response to last year's Chevron release, which resulted from years of deferred maintenance. He said that Cal-OSHA, which is tasked with monitoring, had improved regulations and had made plans to increase inspection staff.

President Lloyd reported that there had been a meeting with Supervisor John Gioia about the intersection of Rincon and Arlington Avenues. He said that those involved were actively pursuing possible improvements.

STAFF COMMENTS

Adding to President Lloyd's comments, GM/COP Harman reported that Supervisor Gioia and other County representatives had met with parents about this intersection and that Office Ramos, who attended the meeting in the GM/COP's stead, had noted that many drivers had found the intersection's signal confusing. Recommendations that emerged from the meeting were to add signage ("Prepare to Stop") and to move the limit line.

CONSENT CALENDAR

MOTION: Director Toombs moved, and Director Welsh seconded, that the Board accept the Consent Calendar.

Motion passed 5 to 0.

DISTRICT OLD BUSINESS

1. The District held a Proposition 218 Public Hearing in response to Bay View Refuse's request for an increase to mini-can rates, 32-gallon can rates, and all other rates to be effective January 1, 2014. The notice for this hearing had already been mailed to all customers.

President Lloyd asked GM/COP Harman and Rick Simonson, of HF&H, to summarize the events that had led to the Proposition 218 Hearing.

GM/COP Harman provided a recent history of events, and Mr. Simonson reviewed the proposed rates. Mr. Simonson explained that the proposed rates would result in an overall increase of 21%, with the mini-can rate increasing 44.8% so that it would be better aligned with the costs incurred to provide service for this sized can.

GM/COP reviewed the steps that had been taken, with respect to providing notice to ratepayers about the proposed rate changes and the Proposition 218 Hearing. He stated that, on October 25, 2013, notices, which explained the amounts and the purpose of the proposed rate increases, had been mailed to Kensington's ratepayers. He further stated that the Proposition 218 information had appeared in the Kensington Outlook and that notices had been posted at the library, on the kiosk, and on the District's website. GM/COP concluded by reporting that the District had received 19 letters protesting the proposed rate increases.

President Lloyd called for public comments.

Randi Weiss stated that she objected to the proposed 44.8% increase in the mini-can rate because it would penalize residents for reducing waste.

Gloria Morrison agreed with Ms. Weiss and said that the proposed rate increases were unwise and unfair. She said that the biggest burden would be borne by those generating the least amount of garbage and that she would prefer to see uniform percentage rate increases.

Mabry Benson said she would like people to think about the overall cost for the removal of recyclables and trash.

Another resident said she objected to the substantial increase in the mini-can rate. She cited that there had been a 20% increase in mini-can subscription since its introduction,

that the franchise agreement was a problem, and that she would prefer the Board to adopt the Option 2 proposed rates.

Peter van Leif, who identified himself as a senior citizen, said that the cumulative increase in Social Security over the past 16 years was equal to the proposed one-year increase in the mini-can rate. He also said that he'd like to see the Outlook publish a history of the rates since 1997.

Rosalyn Heimburg said that she uses only half a 20-gallon can and wondered if anyone was questioning Bay View Refuse's extraordinarily high expenses. She also said that, when the District goes out for bids in 2015, she would like to see everything questioned, with respect to service.

Susan Sorenson said that she would like to see service expanded to include batteries and kitchen waste. She also encouraged everyone to cut the service in half and then receive credits for this from Bay View.

Randi Weiss asked if the mini-can rate could be adjusted downward or if he proposed rates needed to be accepted.

Allison Schutte responded that, to meet revenue requirements, the District would need to accept the rates as noticed. She said that Prop. 218 hearings afforded residents the opportunity to express their opinions but that, only if more than 50% of residents had objected, then the Board could reconsider the proposed rates.

Vice President Gillette clarified that the current contract required a certain level of revenue and that, when the District solicits RFPs, the Board would seek better rates and service.

Director Lipscomb summarized the HF&H rate review, which ascertained that Bay View Refuse's expenses were reasonable, by industry standards. She said that the proposed rates should generate the level of revenue needed to meet the contractual profit obligation of 12%.

Vida Dorroh asked that a future contract allow for backyard service.

Director Toombs said that the mini-can users needed to pay more so that they're no longer subsidized by other sized can users.

Karl Kruger said that he was surprised that residents were upset about garbage rates but not about legal fees.

Director Toombs responded by saying that the settlement with Bay View resulted in what the District had offered prior to Bay View pursuing arbitration: a rate review.

Rick Simonson concluded by saying that this was not just about can costs – it was about recycling, yard waste, and garbage – and that many communities had been dealing with this same situation.

Allison Schutte concluded by saying that the Board had met all legal requirements, with respect to the Prop. 218 Hearing.

MOTION: Director Toombs moved, and Director Welsh seconded, that the public hearing be closed.

Motion passed 5 to 0.

AYES: Lloyd, Gillette, Lipscomb, Toombs, Welsh NOES: 0 ABSENT:

Vice President Gillette said that the goal was to get through this contract and then to move onto a new contract that would embrace all the things that members of the community had expressed.

President Lloyd said that members of the Board were members of the community, too, and that they would be paying these rates for service.

MOTION: Director Toombs moved, and Director Welsh seconded, that the Board accept the recommended rates, which were listed in the mailed Prop. 218 Hearing notices.

Motion passed 5 to 0.

DISTRICT NEW BUSINESS

1. Bryan Godbe of Godbe Research presented the findings of the survey of District voters to evaluate the feasibility of a potential future revenue measure to help fund improvements to the Community Center. The Board discussed the survey results and direction for a possible revenue ballot measure to be considered by the voters at a future election.

Director Toombs, Chairman of the Parks Building Committee, summarized the recent work of the Parks Building Committee, especially the recent telephone survey. He introduced Bryan Godbe, of Godbe Research, and Catherine Lew, of the Lew Edwards Group.

Mr. Godbe summarized the methodology used and the findings derived from the survey. While referring to a handout he had prepared, Mr. Godbe described the steps that had been taken throughout the survey process: from the actual survey, which had been conducted between November 7 and November 16th; through the various findings derived; to the conclusions drawn. Based on these, Mr. Godbe concluded that there would be a good likelihood of success, with at least two-thirds supportive votes, if the Board

chose to place a \$14 per \$100 of assessed value per parcel bond measure, to fund improvements to the Community Center, on the June 2014 ballot.

At 9:45, Director Toombs noted that the Board needed to consider a motion to extend the meeting past 10:00 PM.

MOTION: Director Toombs moved, and Director Lipscomb seconded, that the meeting be extended until the Board had completed all the business on its agenda. Motion passed 5 to 0.

AYES: Lloyd, Gillette, Lipscomb, Toombs, Welsh NOES: 0 ABSENT:

Director Toombs said that, in January 2014, the Board would need to make a decision whether or not to move forward with placing a measure on the ballot.

John Stein, a member of the Park Buildings Committee, summarized the purpose of the Godbe survey. He said it was conducted to ascertain how residents would likely vote. He thanked Bryan Godbe, Director Toombs, Director Lipscomb, Lisa Caronna, Jack Griffith, and Andrew Reed for their work with the committee. Mr. Stein said that three KPPCSD positions would appear on the November ballot. Therefore, it seemed likely that the June ballot would likely offer better success for a measure soliciting support for park building funds.

Mr. Stein concluded by saying that the Park Buildings Committee would prepare a timeline and that, should the Board decide to move forward, the paperwork for the measure would need to be filed by the first week in March.

Catherine Lew, President and CEO of Lew Edwards, introduced herself and said that her company had been involved with about 600 projects during the prior 30 years. She said that her independent review of the Godbe survey results caused her to be optimistic about a June election. As such, Ms. Lew recommended that the Board take action, at a Special Meeting at the end of February, to place a General Obligation Bond measure on the June 2014 ballot.

Ms. Lew further recommended that that a Message Training be scheduled for January; that information be placed on the District website; that community presentations be made; and that three informational mailings be sent to the community in January, February and March. Ms. Lew recommended that, subsequent to these steps, all efforts be transferred to an independent campaign committee.

Director Toombs said that the \$24,000, which the Board had previously authorized for Godbe's consulting and survey work, included services provided by Ms. Lew and that among the services that Ms. Lew would provide would be assisting the independent committee that would educate the community.

Director Lipscomb said that this would be a good time to place a bond measure on the ballot because of the current low rates.

President Lloyd said that he would like to proceed, provided there would be a balanced approach to the District's finances.

Director Welsh inquired whether the proposed bond amount would cover everything. Director Toombs responded that the bond amount would be supplemented by \$300,000 of District funds and between \$225,000 and \$250,000 of funds from the Kensington Community Council.

Director Welsh said there would need to be community education.

Vice President Gillette said that she believed the measure would be successful and that this would be money well spent because the District needs to make the community attractive to new young families.

Director Toombs concluded the discussion, thanking Mr. Godbe and Ms. Lew and saying that, in January, the Board would need to make a decision whether to move forward.

2. The Board discussed the General Manager/Chief of Police's eligibility for a 1% merit increase for the contract period July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013.

President Lloyd provided background information. He said that last year, the GM/COP had earned a 5% salary increase for performance and that Board had, at that time, implemented a merit compensation program. He said that the merit portion of the compensation package was discretionary and couldn't be paid until the end of the year. President Lloyd said that he had found GM/COP Harman's performance more than satisfactory. President Lloyd concluded by saying that the Board had the option to grant a 1% merit increase, and he solicited Board discussion.

Director Lipscomb said she was very pleased to report that the GM/COP had performed very well and that he had met or exceeded his goals and objectives. She said that she had also looked at the COP salaries for other nearby and/or similar agencies:

Albany	\$164,532
El Cerrito	\$178,939
Piedmont	\$172,692
Broadmoor	\$162,000

Director Lipscomb said that a 1% merit increase would equal \$1,500 over the course of one year and that she favored the 1% increase.

Vice President Gillette said that the 1% increase would be effective as of July 1, 2013. She said that she appreciated all that GM/COP Harman had done. She said he was dedicated, that he was performing at a high level, and that he was doing all he could to

make the District better. However, she said she had reservations about the money associated with a 1% merit increase.

Director Welsh said he had been very impressed by GM/COP Harman's performance. As such, Director Welsh said that the GM/COP had more than earned the 1% increase.

Director Toombs said he believed that GM/COP Harman had done a good job. He said that this increase would bring the GM/COP closer to parity with his peers, who do the COP job - not both the COP and GM jobs. He said that talent costs money.

Vice President Gillette noted that the police officers had not received a raise for three years.

President Lloyd asked for public comments.

Mabry Benson said that, because GM/COP Harman had refused to provide access to public records, he should not be granted a 1% merit increase.

President Lloyd responded, saying that he disagreed with Ms. Benson's statement that the GM/COP had unlawfully withheld records.

Director Welsh said that the GM/COP Harman's salary appears not to be at market level.

John Stein said that the 1% merit increase had been well earned, that GM/COP Harman had done an unbelievable job in a hard environment, although the past year had been better. Mr. Stein said that the District had financial issues that were greater than the 1% merit increase and pay for the officers.

Mr. Stein added that GM/COP Harman's salary was below market; that it did not reflect the fact that the GM/COP was doing two jobs; and that the community would learn, upon GM/COP Harman's retirement, just how expensive it would be to replace him.

Mr. Stein went on to say that something was very wrong, when the Fire District had more money than they knew what to with and the KPPCSD didn't have enough to cover expenses. He said that the Fire District had spent \$3,500 every year for a holiday party for El Cerrito firefighters and their families.

Mr. Stein concluded by saying that, on an average per-household basis, the Fire District received \$1,000 more per year than the Police District.

Director Lipscomb said that GM/COP Harman was a good and brave man and that he had made two arrests in the prior week.

MOTION: Vice President Gillette moved, and Director Welsh seconded, that the Board grant a 1% merit increase to the General Manager/Chief of Police. Motion passed 5 to 0.

3. The Board President led the Board discussion about the Board's and General Manager's Goals and Objectives for the 2014 Calendar year.

President Lloyd said that the Board, in prior Closed Sessions, had set nine goals and corresponding objectives. President Lloyd reviewed the matrix of goals and objectives, which was included in the Board Packet.

MOTION: Director Welsh moved, and Director Toombs seconded, the adoption of the goals and objectives proposed for the General Manager/Chief of Police. Motion passed 5 to 0.

AYES: Lloyd, Gillette, Lipscomb, Toombs, Welsh NOES: 0 ABSENT:

4. The Board held its election of Board Officers for the 2014 calendar year.

President Lloyd called for nominations for Board President.

Director Lipscomb nominated Director Welsh. Vice President Gillette seconded the nomination.

President Lloyd closed the nominations, and by unanimous vote, Director Welsh was elected.

President Lloyd asked for nominations for Board Vice President.

Vice President Gillette nominated Director Lipscomb. Director Toombs seconded the nomination.

President Lloyd closed the nominations and, by a vote of 4 to one, Director Lipscomb was elected.

The Board thanked President Lloyd for the good job he had done. President Lloyd complimented the Board and said that serving as President had been a good experience.

The KPPCSD Board and the Park Buildings Committee has requested a separate and detailed accounting of park revenues and expenses.

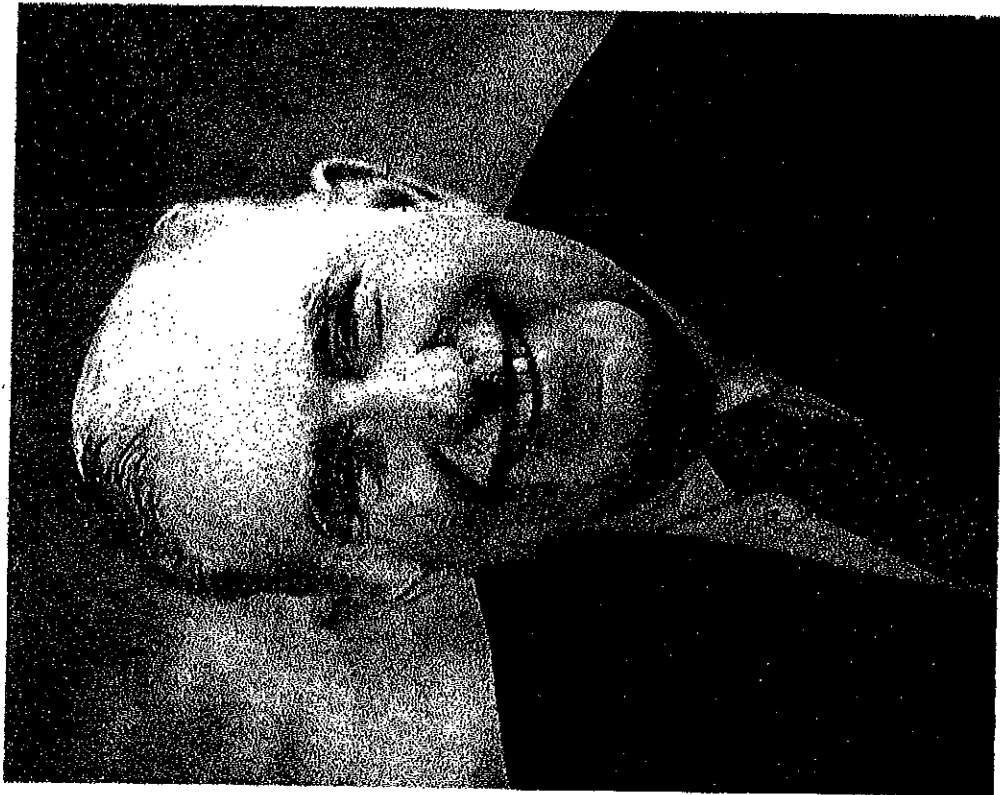

We want to thank Sergeant Ricky and Sergeant Curtis of the Kensington Police force. Their valor and courage turned what could have been a tragic situation into a humorous anecdote. Here is the story.

We purchased a phone for my elderly mother. The idea was she could push a button and the operator would ask her what number she wanted to dial. Oddly the Verizon store clerk said it was all set up when he handed me the box. When we explained we would give it to her in several days and she lived at another address, he said we could change the setup.

When we returned home from lunch we found a series of increasingly urgent phone messages. Apparently when the store tried to set up the phone, the store technicians had pushed 'call' and then turned the phone off. The first message was from Verizon asking if we had a medical emergency. Then there were phone calls from our police dispatch. And we noticed that there was a note from the two officers on our door.

By the time Sergeant Ricky and his partner Sergeant Curtis got the call, they were told there was a possible life threatening emergency at our home. They needed to enter the house to insure no one was dying. Our two dogs are part Malamute, a very excitable breed. When the police entered, the dogs got out.

The police would have been justified if they had left the dogs, or called animal control- or even worse. Instead, once they had ascertained that there was no impending medical emergency, the two officers spent the time to coax our dogs back into the house. Sergeant Ricky confided to me that he had spotted our cookie jar. They used the cookies to entice the dogs inside.

By the time we got home, everything was in order- except the trail of phone calls and cookie crumbs which revealed this story. And two rather satisfied dogs on the couch! Thanks a lot for exceptional police work, Sergeants Ricky and Curtis!

At the July 11, 2013 KPPCSD BOD meeting, WCCUSD Board Member Charles Ramsey addressed the KPPCSD Board. Below is a summary of his comments.

Mr. Ramsey reported that, as a result of recent changes in the way California was funding schools, the WCCUSD would see a doubling of revenues within six years and was enjoying its largest reserve in the school district's history: \$23 million.

He said that the school district was expanding its relationships with police protection services and that the WCCUSD had just expanded its relationship with the City of Richmond. He said that Kensington needed to be included because, in the unincorporated areas, the school district was working with the Contra Costa Sheriff's department.

He went on to say, **"The Superintendent, in light of what happened in Newtown, wants to make sure we don't leave any community without enough public safety. So I welcome your Chief to at least give me some idea of what we can do to enhance what you're doing here to help work with this local community."**

"Everyone, especially Kensington, has been very supportive with parcel taxes and bond measures. We need to continue to collaborate. I'm up here to try to share with you, and I want all of you to think about this: to entertain something; to brainstorm to see if we can come together."

He concluded, "I just want to share this really good news that the District has, especially with the governor making education funding a priority. I know that cities and counties and other areas are still struggling, but for schools it's been a big, big benefit. And, when this local funding really kicks in in two years, for local schools and English language learners, it's going to make a big, big impact. So, we're excited about that."

In response to an inaudible question, Mr. Ramsey replied that the school district had just entered into a \$475,000 partnership with the Richmond Police Department.

Following Mr. Ramsey's comments, then KPPCSD Board President Tony Lloyd, Sergeant Keith Barrow, and District Administrator Lynn Wolter met to analyze services provided to the WCCUSD's Kensington Hilltop School by the KPPCSD. From this analysis, a proposal was developed and then presented to the WCCUSD on November 5, 2013.

On November 6, 2013, during Board Member Comments, President Lloyd reported on this meeting and the proposal to the KPPCSD Board and the community and let the Board know that there would be follow-up meetings on the matter. There was no opposition expressed by the Board or the community.

In early March, 2014, Mr. Lloyd received a phone call from WCCUSD Board President Ramsey, letting him know that, at its March 12, 2014 Board meeting, Mr. Ramsey would be presenting, for an up or down vote, a proposal for the WCCUSD to enter into a partnership with the KPPCSD. Mr. Ramsey indicated that there would be time on the agenda for Kensington to make a presentation, and he asked that Mr. Lloyd bring two others with him for this purpose.

On March 12, 2014, in response to Mr. Ramsey's proposal to enter into a partnership, the WCCUSD voted unanimously to support Mr. Ramsey's proposal of a partnership in which the WCCUSD would resume providing funding for services it had paid for in the past but had to abandon when the school district was in the throes of financial distress. His proposal was to enter into an agreement to provide up to \$50,000 per year for three years to the KPPCSD.

On March 13, 2014, Mr. Ramsey attended the KPPCSD Board meeting and addressed the Board and the community about the proposed agreement. Among the points he made:

- The passage of Proposition 30 had added \$12.5 million to the WCCUSD's operating budget
- Governor Brown's local control funding formula had provided additional significant operating funds
- The WCCUSD had \$24 million in unallocated reserves
- It was important to accomplish things for all parts of the school district
- That other schools and geographic areas within the school district were already receiving funds for police services and safety (Hercules, El Cerrito, Richmond, San Pablo, and unincorporated areas through a partnership with the Sheriff's Dept.)

I as the General Manager/ Chief of Police, would like to personally take this opportunity to address the historic partnership between the school district and the KPPCSD, and what the relationship could look like moving forward.

For approximately 20 years now, the KPPCSD has been funding the school crossing guard at the Arlington traffic light to provide pedestrian safety for those using the crosswalk during school commute times.

Since my arrival in 2007, I have always stressed to our officers the importance of traffic enforcement around the school area as a method to increase pedestrian

safety. We have always provided additional traffic enforcement during the beginning of the school year and during "Walk to School Days" to assist parents and students commute to school in a safe manner.

We have participated in the Hilltop Carnival, emergency preparedness drills, and other school related activities in order to provide access to our officers and support to the school community in our partnership to provide additional safety and security to the school.

I have also required school security checks during off school hours to make sure the school facility and those individuals on school grounds after hours are safe and free from any type of criminal activity.

However, following recent tragic events that have occurred during school hours at other school campuses in the nation, I have also required our police personnel to make school safety checks while school is in session during the day.

With the generous offer of possible funding we have received from the school district, we will be able to continue our partnership with the school community and possibly increase our involvement with the additional resources to add a part time School Resource Officer and additional traffic safety enforcement in the school area.

We are currently waiting to receive an agreement from the school district for funding resources, which when received, will be placed on the KPPCSD Board agenda for discussion and possible approval.

I have always considered the police department's relationship, as well as my own with Judy Sanders and members of the school community to be a special one, and with the possibility of additional funding, one that can be increased to provide additional safety and security to our number one community asset, our kids.

The first step in the process is the approval of Resolution 2014-02; the initiating of proceedings for the levy and collection of the assessments for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2014/2015.

The second step of the process is the approval of Resolution 2014-03; the approval of the Annual Report for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2014/2015. A copy of the report titled, "Engineer's Report Fiscal Year 2014/ 2015", is attached to the resolution for review and Board approval.

The third step is of the process is the approval of Resolution 2014-04; the Board's declaring its intention to levy and collect assessments for the Kensington Park Assessment District for Fiscal Year 2014/2015 and set the public hearing for Thursday, May 8th, at 7:30 PM. Once Resolution 2014-04 is passed, it will need to be published in the local paper at least 10 days prior the May 8th public meeting.

The total assessment to each dwelling unit is \$15.24, which is an increase from \$14.87 last year, with a total of 2,188 parcels to be assessed. The total balance to levy will be \$34,334.92. This revenue can only be used for maintenance of the "New Park".

The final step in the process will be the holding of the public meeting on May 8th and the approval of Resolution 2014-05.

The Board of Directors of the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District ("KPPCSD"), State of California, has directed NBS Government Finance Group, DBA NBS ("NBS"), to prepare and file a report presenting plans and specifications describing the general nature, location, and extent of the improvements to be maintained and an estimate of the costs of the maintenance and operations and servicing of the improvements for the Kensington Park Assessment District (the "District") for Fiscal Year 2014/15 pursuant to the provisions of the *Landscape and Lighting Act of 1972, Part 2, Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code (commencing with Section 22500)* (hereafter referred to as the "Act").

The report includes a diagram for the District, showing the area and properties proposed to be assessed, an assessment of the estimated costs of the maintenance, operations and servicing the improvements, and the net amount upon all assessable lots and/or parcels within the District in proportion to the special benefit received.

The assessment rate and the annual rate escalation factor of the annual San Francisco Bay Area CPI were approved by property owners through the assessment balloting procedures set forth in Section 4 of Article XIID of the California Constitution following a public hearing on May 28, 1997.

The following assessment is made to cover the portion of the estimated costs of maintenance, operation and servicing of said improvements to be paid by the assessable real property within the District in proportion to the special benefit received.

2. OVERVIEW

2.1. Introduction

On December 6, 1994, KPPCSD formed the District for the purpose of providing improvements which benefit parcels in the District. Since that time, the District has been levying and collecting special assessments to pay for maintaining and servicing those improvements.

This Engineer's Report ("Report") describes the District and the proposed charge per Equivalent Dwelling Unit (E.D.U.) for Fiscal Year 2014/15 based on the historical and estimated costs to maintain the improvements and to provide the services that benefit parcels within the District. Maintenance and operation of the facilities provides a healthy alternative for youth and adult activities while protecting the capital investments that have been made within the District.

The word "parcel," for the purposes of this Report, refers to an individual property assigned its own Assessor's Parcel Number by the Contra Costa County Assessor's Office. The Contra Costa County Auditor/Controller uses Assessor's Parcel Numbers and specific Fund Numbers, to identify on the tax roll, properties assessed for special district benefit assessments.

Following consideration of public comments at a noticed public hearing, the Board of Directors may confirm the diagram and may order the levy and collection of assessments for Fiscal Year 2014/15. If approved, the assessment information shall be submitted to the Contra Costa County Auditor/Controller and included on the property tax roll for each benefiting parcel for Fiscal Year 2014/15.

2.2. Effect of Proposition 218

On November 5, 1996, California voters approved Proposition 218 by a margin of 56.5% to 43.5%. The provisions of the Proposition, now California Constitutional Articles XIII C and XIII D, adds substantive and procedural requirements to assessments, which affect the KPPCSD maintenance assessments.

The assessment rate and the annual rate escalation factor of the annual San Francisco Bay Area CPI were approved by property owners through the assessment balloting procedures set forth in Section 4 of Proposition 218 following a public hearing on May 28, 1997. The San Francisco Bay Area CPI increase for the period ending February 2014 was 2.45%.

2.3. Description of District and Services

The District operates, services, and maintains the following improvements:

- Landscaping and grass
- Water and electric services
- Equipment and supplies
- Repair or replacement of existing improvements
- Addition of future improvements (if determined to be necessary)

The District consists of a residential area, generally located north of the Contra Costa County line, east of Santa Fe Avenue, west of Kensington Road and south of Gelston Place.

3. ESTIMATE OF COSTS

3.1. Description of Budget Items

Operations & Maintenance - Includes the following:

Tree Pruning/Removal - Includes the costs for trimming trees and removal of debris.

Utilities - Includes the costs for water to irrigate the landscaping and the costs for electricity for street lighting.

Miscellaneous Services/Equipment - Includes the costs for maintaining and replenishing equipment and supplies.

Miscellaneous Repairs - Includes any infrastructure repair on District Property, including repairs to buildings.

Incidental Expenses - Includes the following:

Administrative Services - Includes services necessary for District maintenance, including preparation of the Annual Engineer's Report and expenses for the services of KPPCSD personnel.

Levy Fees - Includes the County of Contra Costa parcel charges to collect the assessments on the County Tax Roll.

4. METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT

4.1. Method of Apportionment

Pursuant to the Act, the costs of the District may be apportioned by any formula or method which fairly distributes the net amount to be assessed among all assessable parcels in proportion to the estimated special benefit to be received by each such parcel from the maintenance, servicing, and operation of the improvements. The formula used for the District reflects the composition of the parcels and the improvements and services provided to fairly apportion the costs based on the estimated benefits to each parcel.

The benefit was determined to be equal for all Equivalent Dwelling Units (E.D.U.) within the District.

Kensington Park Assessment District

The method used to calculate the assessments within the District is as follows:

$$\text{Total Balance to Levy} / \text{Total E.D.U.} = \text{Levy per E.D.U.}$$

To determine the E.D.U. for assessable parcels, the Benefit Unit Factor (B.U.F.) is multiplied by the number of developed residential units on the parcel. Undeveloped and non-residential parcels are not assessed. The CPI Rate Escalation Factor is applied to the Levy per E.D.U. each year.

The Operations and Maintenance are of special benefit to those parcels in the District. The benefit derived by the community at large is negligible and is considered a general benefit.

4.3. Balance To Levy

Total District Costs – Includes the Maintenance and Operations and Incidental costs determined above, in Section 3 of this Report.

Other Funding Sources – This is the amount of surplus or deficit funds resulting from the previous year's assessments. This can also include funds designated for use by the District that are not from District Assessments. These funds are added to or subtracted from the District account, and assessments adjusted accordingly.

Balance to Levy -- This is the total amount to be levied and collected through assessments for the current fiscal year. The Balance to Levy represents the sum of the Maintenance and Operations, Incidental Expenses, Beginning Balance, (deficit or surplus from last year) and Other Funding Sources less installment rounding.

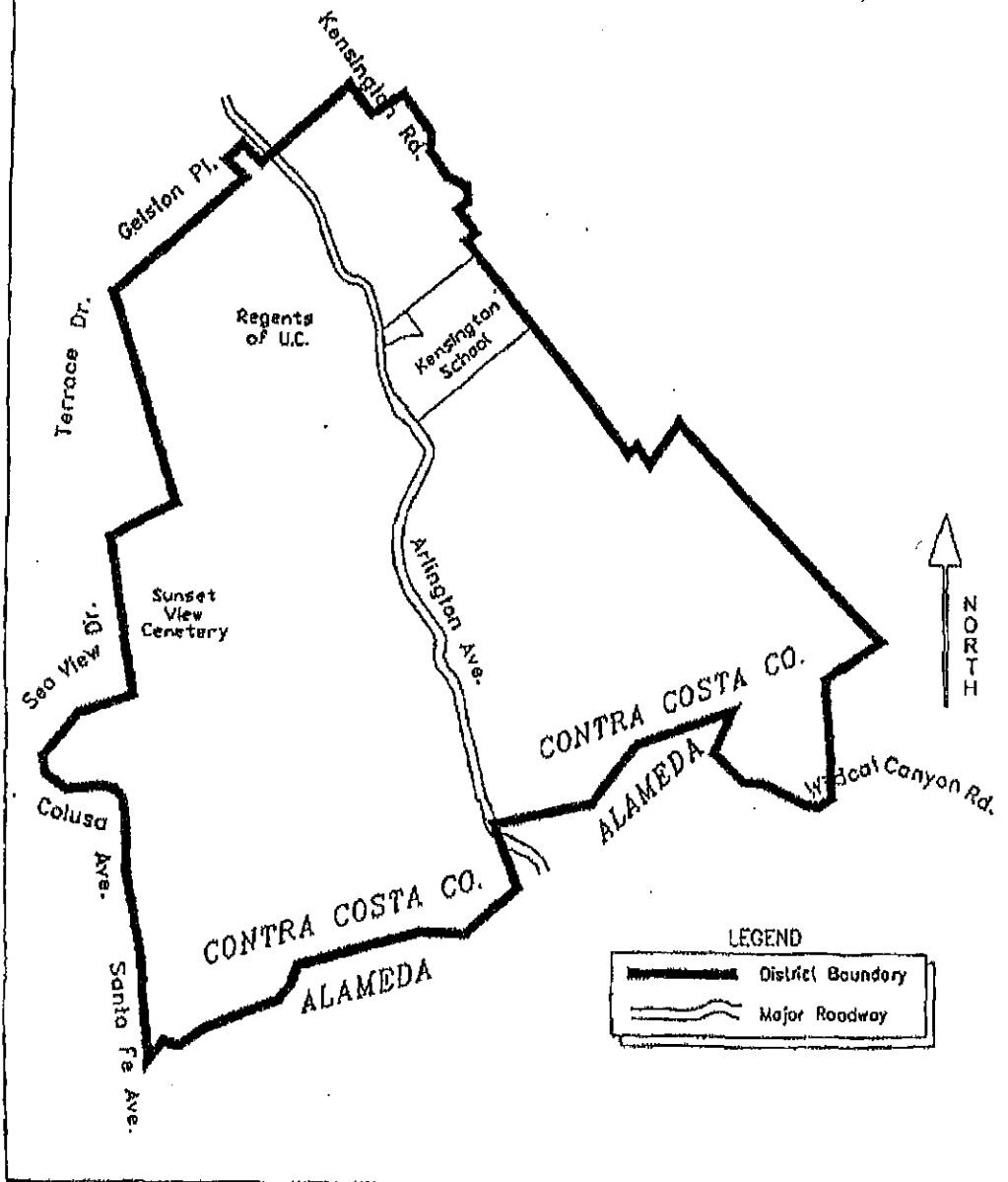

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE KENSINGTON POLICE PROTECTION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT,
DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO LEVY AND COLLECT ASSESSMENTS FOR
THE KENSINGTON PARK ASSESSMENT DISTRICT
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014/15**

The Board of Directors of the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District (hereafter referred to as the "Board of Directors") does resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors previously completed its proceedings in accordance with and pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, Part 2, Division 15 of the California Streets and Highways Code (commencing with Section 22500) (the "Act") to establish the Kensington Park Assessment District (the "Assessment District"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has retained NBS for the purpose of assisting with the annual levy of the Assessment District, and the preparation and filing of an Annual Report.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Intention:** The Board of Directors hereby declares its intention to levy and collect assessments within the Assessment District to pay the costs of the Improvements for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015. The Board of Directors finds that the public's best interest requires such action.
2. **Improvements:** The improvements within the District include, but are not limited to: the operating, maintaining and servicing of all public landscaping improvements, consisting of landscaping and grass. Operating, maintaining and servicing include, but are not limited to: personnel, materials, electrical energy and water. Services provided include all necessary service, operations, administration and maintenance required to keep the improvements in a healthy, vigorous, and satisfactory condition.
3. **Assessment District Boundaries:** The boundaries of the Assessment District are as shown by the assessment diagram filed in the offices of the Secretary, which map is made a part hereof by reference.
4. **Annual Report:** Reference is made to the Annual Report prepared by NBS, on file with the Secretary, for a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the Assessment District and the zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the Assessment District.
5. **Notice of Public Hearing:** The Board of Directors hereby declares its intention to conduct a Public Hearing concerning the levy of assessments in accordance with Section 22629 of the Act. All objections to the assessment, if any, will be considered by the Board of Directors. The Public Hearing will be held on **Thursday, May 8, 2014 at 7:30 pm** or as soon thereafter as is feasible in the meeting place of the Board of Directors located at 59 Arlington Avenue, Kensington, CA. The Board of Directors further orders the Secretary to publish notice of this resolution in accordance with Section 22626 of the Act.
6. **Increase of Assessment:** The maximum assessment is not proposed to increase from the previous year above that previously approved by the property owners (as "increased assessment" is defined in Section 54954.6 of the Government Code).
